1960- 1964	Membership numbers		Following a dues increase, membership dropped from 381 ('60) to 295 ('61) and rebounded to 375 ('64)
1961- 1965	Budget		Ranged from \$7,580 ('62) to \$10,920 ('65) per year
1961	School Health Education Study	Board of Trustees	Passed resolution to cooperate with SHES, funded by Samuel Bronfman Foundation
1961	Discontinued publishing Proceedings	Board of Trustees	Decided that the Newsletter would be used to report the proceedings of the annual meetings
1961	Broadening membership criteria	Board of Trustees	Approved revisions of the Constitution and Bylaws to permit persons with degrees from schools of public health, but without experience, to hold membership; those with other than a graduate degree from a school of public health needed three years of experience to hold membership
1961- 1965	Health Education Monographs	Publications Committee	Published 11 issues
1962	Health Research	Board of Trustees	Spent \$234 for legal services and

1962	An Executive Director Of IUHE	Winona Bannister	Employed by SOPHE on part-time basis; this improved flow of correspondence and record keeping
1962	Permanent Office	Board of Trustees	Established central office in Rye, New York
1962	Honorary Fellowships	Board of Trustees	Awarded the second Honorary Fellowship to Annette LeMeitour Kaplun and the third to Sioma Kaplun
1962- 1965	SOPHE Citations	SOPHE Executive Committee	Awarded Citations to SOPHE members, including A. helen Martikainen, Lucy A. Morgan, Beryl J. Roberts, and Sol S. Lifson, and non-members, including Howard A. Rusk, Paul Dudley White, William C. Menninger, and Benjamin M. Spock
1962- 1965	Annual Mona B. Sheckman Lecturer	SOPHE Executive Committee	Selected three lecturers, including George James (1962), Warren A. Kraetzer (1963), and Herman E. Hilleboe (1965)
1963	National Capitol Area Chapter and Southern California Chapter	Board of Trustees	Recognized the second and third regional chapters



1963- 1965	Local Chapters	Board of Trustees	Assigned local chapters specific problems to study
1964	North Carolina Chapter	Board of Trustees	Recognized the fourth regional chapter
1964	Emeritus Fellow	Board of Trustees	Established the membership category of Emeritus Fellow with the rights of active SOPHE fellows, but with reduced dues
1965	Honorary Fellowship Award	Board of Trustees	Awarded the Honorary Fellowship to Sally Lucas Jean
1965	Ohio Chapter	Board of Trustees	Recognized the fifth regional chapter
1965- 1970	No SOPHE Newsletter	Board of Trustees	Due to financial difficulties, no newsletter was published
1965- 1970	Membership growth	Membership Committee	Mild positive growth during this period from 405 ('65) to 550 ('70)
1966	No Mona B. Sheckman Foundation Award		Decision not to grant money to SOPHE for this award was based on SOPHE's tax status, which did not provide tax exemption for donations
1966	Tri-State Chapter	Board of Trustees	Recognized the sixth regional chapter, which included new Jersey, New York, and Delaware
1966	Honorary Fellowship	Board of Trustees	Presented this award to Dorothy B. Nyswander and Clair E. Turner
1966	Relocation of Central Office	Board of Trustees	Decided in 1965 to relocate the central office from Rye, New York to New York City



1966- 1970	Financial Crisis	Board of Trustees	Had to use financial reserves in 1965; experienced a deficit in 1966, which required bills of 1966 to be paid in 1967. Donations were made by the Capitol Area chapter, the American Cancer Society, and individual members. A special 5-year membership dues of \$100 lump sum payment for 1968-1972 was approved. Volunteers provided services; members who had received an honorarium for training Peace Corps volunteers donated \$500 to SOPHE
1967	Change in Central Office Staff	Board of Trustees	Approved a move from a part- time executive director to a full- time administrative secretary. Winona Banister continued as executive director through February 1967. Helen T. Gardella became the administrative secretary in March 1967
1967- 1970	SOPHE Board Highlights	Staff and Board	Due to lack of a newsletter, staff and volunteers of the Board of Trustees produced and distributed highlights of the board meetings
1967	Statement of Goals	Board of Trustees	Adopted the Statement of Goals
1967	Ad Hoc Committee on Pre-Professional Preparation	Board of Trustees	Established this ad hoc committee to examine training programs and employment classifications of paraprofessionals in health agencies
1968	New England Chapter	Board of Trustees	Recognized the seventh regional chapter



1968	Survey of Membership	Committee on Membership Communications	Found 71% of membership in SOPHE to be health educators; others were administrators, health care providers, students, and other. Twenty-two percent worked for local government or voluntary agencies, 24% for colleges and universities, 17% for federal government or national voluntary agencies, 2% for hospitals or clinics, and 15% were self-employed or worked for other than the above. 68% were members of chapters
1968- 1972	Basic Bibliographies	Research and Studies Committee	Published and distributed Basic Bibliographies both to meet a perceived need of health educators and to generate income for SOPHE; it generated \$600
1969	Reincorporation	Board of Trustees	Approved a plan for reincorporation
1969	Consultants on Quality Assurance	Committee on Professional Preparation and Practice	Organized nine regional panels of health education specialists for use by APHA when conducting accreditation reviews and site visits
1969	Recommendation on Pre-professional Preparation	Executive Committee	Contacted the Professional Examination Service of APHA with suggestion that it solicit recommendations for achieving greater uniformity in training and use of aids in health education functions
1969	Special Issue of Health Education Monoggraphs	American Cancer Society	ACS contracted the special issue on cancer research with financial support of \$2,500
1969	Approval of Plan to Change the name of	Board of Trustees	Conveyed the concept that SOPHE is devoted primarily to
