



Call for Papers: HPP *Photovoice* Special Issue

Photovoice: Past and Future Directions

Papers Accepted June 1, 2020 – January 31, 2021

Anticipated Publication Date January 2022

Health Promotion Practice seeks to curate a body of salient papers that explore the current state and future directions of photovoice. Of particular interest are papers that demonstrate the use of photovoice as a vehicle for illuminating issues of concern, promoting health equity, advocating for social justice, and advancing efforts to positively influence policy, systems, and/or environments.

The specific aims of the special Issue are to:

- Contribute to the ongoing development of the photovoice method.
- Showcase photovoice projects that engage in illuminating issues of concern, promoting health equity, advocating for social justice, examining power relationships, and advancing efforts to positively influence policy, systems, and/or environments.
- Celebrate HPP's 20+ year commitment to photovoice scholarship.

HPP's editorial board welcomes submissions of evidence-based and/or conceptually grounded scholarship about photovoice in the following areas:

- **History and key foundational elements** – Overview or theoretical pieces that challenge our thinking and expand the method's horizons.
- **Research frontiers** – Examination of challenges that need to be addressed, growth areas for the method, and unique contributions of the method within different contexts.
- **Exemplars** – Applications of the photovoice method.

Submission Requirements

HPP will accept manuscripts in response to this call between June 1, 2020 and January 31, 2021, with an early expedited review for papers submitted by September 1, 2020. Please follow the journal's submission guidelines (<http://bit.ly/2RvhSGG>), noting in the cover letter that you are responding to the Photovoice Special Issue Call for Papers. HPP welcomes submissions in several formats as per the HPP Guidelines for Prospective Authors: Full-length original articles, longer implementation articles, review articles, research briefs, and reflective commentaries. All submitted manuscripts will undergo standard peer review by the HPP editors and peer referees, as defined by HPP policy. This call will yield papers that will be published in HPP online and in print in January 2022. Supporting material, including photographs, project guides, and exhibition projects will be linked to the papers.
